- Low-mid income (35k-78k per year

- No bankruptcy claims within last 2 years
- Have 2 or more children under the age of 12
- Be living in housing not suitable because of overcrowding, unsafe/unhealthy and unaffordability

Albert McMahon closure:

- Underground pump damaged due to rainfall collapsing wall onto unit
- Temporary bypass used to remove waste
- Extra curricular activities may need to be relocated temporarily

Special Education Audit:

- All files for special needs students funding will be reviewed
- Any error will result in a loss of funding for the student

Budget:

- Changes need to be made to help cut costs
- Delaying hiring process for facility manager
- Review all staffing levels and budgets

Emergency Kits:

- All schools have kits (on a small scale)

- Water filtration would be more beneficial than water bottles
